## KBA SCHOLARSHIP AWARD



To our Senior and Regular Members:

The KBA is now accepting applications for the annual scholarship award. We will be presenting a scholarship to a KBA member or dependent of a member in the amount of \$500.00. January 1st is the deadline for accepting applications each year.

One or two scholarships will be awarded annually, depending on the availability of funds. Each year, the winner(s) will be announced at the KBA Annual Convention Banquet. Payment will be made in-full to the scholarship winner upon receipt of proof of enrollment. Any KBA member, or their son or daughter, who is a high school senior or already enrolled in college and interested in applying should fill out the application, provide all other required documents listed at the bottom of this page and mail it to Lee Ayers. In evaluating students for the scholarship award, the following criteria will be used:

Criteria	POINT VALUE ASSIGNED
1. ACT OR SAT results (depending on test score)	0-25
2. Grade point average	0-25
3. Verified school & community volunteer activities*	0-25
4. Submitted essay on conservation and bowhunting (approximately 250 words)	0-25
5. Bonus points for conservation major or minor, hunting/bowhunting experience and outdoor interests	d/or other 0-25

<sup>\*</sup> to receive activity points, the student must have a letter from a teacher, school administrator or from a coordinator of the volunteer activity that can verify participation.

## Requirements for the Scholarship Application

- 1. The applicant or parent/guardian of the applicant must be a member of the KBA
- 2. The applicant must be a high school senior or currently enrolled in a college or university
- 3. The applicant must completely fill out the application and submit it to Lee Ayers, along with:
  - a. A copy of his/her ACT or SAT test results, as well as evidence of GPA.
  - b. A letter of verification written by the sponsor of each activity for which the applicant is seeking credit. Students will receive extra points for conservation work and extracurricular activities, ONLY if the application includes these letters of verification.
  - c. A short essay (approximately 250 words) written by the applicant on the topic: What can today's bowhunter do to promote the image of bowhunting?
